It is also recognized as a tremendously challenging medium to master, especially when comes to painting from a live model. It requires a lot of confidence, practice and understanding of the human form and structure. In this one day workshop, JJ will impart his years of experience with this subject by giving one or more demo(s) and leading the group in a variety of exercises. The goals of this workshop include: introducing some fundamentals of watercolor figure painting, allaying some of the fears of exploring this subject in watercolor, and giving the participants a firsthand opportunity to closely observe the instructor confronting these challenges. By participating, they will be more prepared to take the next step of practice on their own.

JJ Jiang is a gifted and classically trained artist and a respected teacher; he possesses solid foundations in drawing, perspective and colors. Though accomplished in watercolor, he also excels in oils, Chinese brush painting/calligraphy and with a variety of subjects including landscape and cityscapes, human figures and portraits, as well as still life.
